## September 2, 2025

Mr. Anthony Sellers gave the Invocation and Ms. Tina Aaron led the pledge of allegiance.

Commissioner Dunagan stated, "Thank everybody for coming today. I have several things to add. I've got a Common Laborer I need to get started, it's a vacant spot. I need to add that as Item 11. And then Item 12, we have some vehicles being sold on GovDeals that need to be approved for sale; a 2007 F-250 VIN#2106, 1988 Peterbilt Truck VIN#4246 and a 2005 Freightliner Truck VIN#5942."

Commissioner Dunagan stated, "Ms Aaron and your staff (HARTT) thank you for what you do. We do have a problem in this County. We're hoping it will be addressed pretty soon. So, thank y'all. Thank you to our staff for everything you do. Again, we work for the citizens of Walker County. My door is always open. If anybody in District One would like to see my budget or what I spend your tax dollars on, I'll be happy to sit down and show you. I have no problem with that. I have no problem talking to any citizen in District One or the rest of Walker County. Me and my guys are trying to work every day to improve District One. I appreciate the citizens that have reached out to me. My guys do appreciate it. I ask you to continue watching us while we're out cutting, to make sure my guys make it home safely to their families. I'm glad everybody had a safe and happy Labor Day. On that I'll pass it to Jeff. He had the worst weekend."

Commissioner Burrough stated, "Unfortunately, Alabama fans didn't have too good of a weekend. But, thanks Tina for what y'all do. We appreciate you coming and I don't know Chairman, are we going to have a work session on this or do we want to add it to the agenda? I'll leave that to Steven. Thank y'all for coming. Janet, I appreciate the grant work you do. I'm interested in what it takes to get road work done. And that's the only reason why I'm asking that – and I know you are too. But we've got to search and try to find ones that we can get some road work done. Thank you, thank you for everybody that's here. The rest of the girls that work in the office, y'all do a superb job helping us and we appreciate it very much.

I got an update on Nichols and Hillard Loop. Glenn, we both have busy weeks, but Hillard Loop is finished. We'll have to figure out a way to maybe put some reflectors or some striping down the middle of the road. This is an area out between Townley and Pleasant Grove area that Hillard Loop has two sides to it, both sides were rough and we paved one side of it the west side and it is posted no trucks. The other side we have a lot of trucking going that way and I hope they will stay on the left-hand side. Those people are excited to get that road paved. I'm excited to get that road paved, I had phone calls all the time about something going on. Nichols Road is another one. They patched it last week. I haven't been there this morning, but I assume they're out there laying asphalt right now on Nichols Road. And that's another residential area road that has had a lot of problems like culvert problems, potholes. I'm super glad to get that fixed. And while we are doing the stuff on GovDeals with Solid Waste, Chairman, District Two has several things listed on GovDeals, I think, currently right now, you know, some of the older equipment that we just have replaced with newer equipment and just decided to post some of it. And I encourage people in the public to get on - or check out the website, Gov.Deals. There is no charge to sign up. Of course, there is a probation period of time when you do sign up you can only bid and purchase on two or three items before you actually pay and then you sort of gain their trust and they'll open up and let you, you know, bid on a bunch of stuff. Gov. Deals is the way we get rid of our surplus and I encourage the public to check into their website and, you know, if they're interested in any old equipment and most of it is older and used, but, you know, there's still some life in it. But we do have several things in District Two on there right now. Other than that, thank you for coming."

Commissioner Borden stated, "Thank everyone for being here. Janet, thank you for what you do to communicate and get bids. As Jeff said, a lot of these grants, we're looking for monies for our road system. We need pavement on the ground. A lot of these grants that are out there that people say, you know, you're not applying for grants, you're not applying for grants. I don't need a grant money to spend on somebody to come in and tell me you need to fill up the potholes. I know the potholes are there. So, that is not money well spent in my eye. But Janet does a good job, behind the scene she works on grants for all the departments county-wide. Anybody out – I think some of the volunteer fire departments and smaller municipalities will reach out to her for a little bit of assistance. So, she does a good job on that as far as puts a lot of time in it.

I want to thank all of our county employees, all of our first responders. I'll close with this: We're out doing our mowing on the right of ways, just be attentive with your driving, 45 miles an hour road means 45 not 65. We put the signs out, but the guys when they come in in the evening they constantly have horror stories where they're mowing down the side of the road in a curve and this is a small narrow county road, these cars will come by them, you can estimate the speed when you've been out there long enough. These cars are sliding by them, they slide up on the rear of the bushhogs and just, it's dangerous, dangerous, dangerous. I just ask you people again, just be attentive this time of the year until frost gets here and we get through with all our mowing. That's all I have."

Commissioner Aderholt stated, "Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I would like to add one more item to the agenda, it will be Item Number 14. That will be to use the Opioid settlement funds to fund the HARTT Programs with two counselors and that's two years to the tune of \$150,000 per year. If I'm correct, you said you've got some people that you've interviewed, it's kind of time sensitive, and you need to bring those folks on board, so this money will come in a quickly needed pace. I'll make that in the form of a motion.

Motion was made by Commissioner Aderholt and seconded by Commissioner Burrough to add Item 14 to the agenda – to Approve \$150,000 each year from the Opioid Settlement funds to the HARTT Program for two years.

With no discussion, the vote taken resulted as follows: District One: Aye; District Two: Aye; District Three: Aye; District Four: Aye; Chairman: Aye.

With no opposition, the Chairman declared the motion carried.

(14) Motion was made by Commissioner Aderholt and seconded by Commissioner Burrough to open for discussion to Approve \$150,000 each year from the Opioid Settlement funds to the HARTT Program for two years.

Commissioner Aderholt stated, "I just thank everybody for being here." He thanked the people from HARTT for what they are doing and thanked everyone again for being here.

Chairman Miller stated, "Gentlemen, I appreciate everything that we've done today. And we certainly appreciate the HARTT Program. I think it's going to be something that's going to help. These folks are very, very important to this community. I look forward to seeing them use these funds for these other counselors. You know, if we save one life, if it turns one person around, it's awesome. That's awesome. That's what we're hoping for, hoping to partner and continue to help.

Thank everybody for coming. Thank all the employees of the County, whether you're law enforcement, whether you're clerks, whether you're maintenance, EMA, it doesn't matter, thank everybody for being here, Probate, Revenue sitting here. You know, we appreciate each and every one. And again, it takes every person working in this county to make this county government function. One is not more important than the other. I know we hear that sometimes, but that's not the case. It takes everybody to make this work. So we appreciate each and every one of you.

Again, back to the SSUT this does not need to be changed. And I hope Mr. Ed will publish this resolution by the Walker County Commission that was unanimous. So with that said, thank each and every one of you for coming and I'll entertain a motion to

adjourn.

# ENCOURAGING THE ALABAMA LEGISLATURE TO OPPOSE ANY LEGISLATIVE CHANGES THAT WOULD DISRUPT THE SSUT PROGRAM'S OPERATIONS OR CALL THE PROGRAM'S CONSTITUTIONALITY INTO QUESTION

WHEREAS, the Alabama Simplified Seller Use Tax (SSUT) Remittance Act, codified at Section 40-23-191 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, was enacted in 2015, establishing a process by which the State of Alabama collects use taxes from eligible sellers on behalf of Alabama consumers; and

WHEREAS, in South Dakota v. Wayfair, 585 U.S. 162 (2018), the United States Supreme Court held that the State may collect taxes from sellers that have a "substantial nexus" in the State, even where there is no physical presence, provided that the tax does not impose an undue burden on interstate commerce; and

WHEREAS, the SSUT program is designed to fall within the United States Supreme Court's guidelines and has been a model for other states across the country; and

WHEREAS, the SSUT program is now under attack by a small group of mayors who have been publicly criticizing the same program that, since its enactment, has provided more than \$4.2 billion in essential revenue to the Alabama General Fund, the Alabama Education Trust Fund, Alabama's 67 county governments, and Alabama's municipal governments; and

WHEREAS, individual counties and municipalities have no constitutionally valid authority to compel online retailers to collect use taxes from Alabama consumers; and

WHEREAS, challenges to and attacks upon the SSUT program place essential revenue at risk for all levels of government and, therefore, are a threat to our State's continued growth.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WALKER COUNTY COMMISSION that the County Commission fully supports the current SSUT program as an efficient, constitutional, and operationally effective process for collecting use taxes due on behalf of Alabama consumers who utilize eligible sellers for delivery of taxable products into Alabama.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE WALKER COUNTY COMMISSION that the revenue generated by the SSUT program will continue to support essential governmental services in the county.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE WALKER COUNTY COMMISSION that the County Commission fully supports the use of population data to allocate the county portion of the revenue among our State's 67 county governments as is currently provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE WALKER COUNTY COMMISSION that the County Commission strongly opposes any legislative efforts to alter the SSUT program in a way that would disrupt its operations or call into question its constitutionality.
