AUTHORIZING WALKER COUNTY TO PROTECT THE COUNTY'S INTERESTS BY INTERVENING

AS A DEFENDANT IN THE SIMPLIFIED SELLER USE TAX LITIGATION

WHEREAS, the Alabama Simplified Seller Use Tax (SSUT) Remittance Act, codified at Section 40-

23-191 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, established a process by which the State of Alabama

collects use taxes from eligible sellers on behalf of Alabama consumers; and

WHEREAS, on August 12, 2025, the City of Tuscaloosa, the School District of the City of

Tuscaloosa, and the City of Mountain Brook filed a lawsuit in the Circuit Court of Montgomery

County, Alabama against Vernon Barnett, in his official capacity as Commissioner of the Alabama

Department of Revenue, asking the Court to direct Commissioner Barnett to disqualify particular

business entities from the SSUT program; and

WHEREAS, on November 10, 2025, the Court imposed a 30-day deadline for any other interested

parties to file motions to intervene in this litigation; and

WHEREAS, the SSUT program has been an essential source of revenue for Walker County, and the

plaintiffs' lawsuit, if successful, would jeopardize the County's ability to maintain the current level

of governmental services it provides to the public.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WALKER COUNTY COMMISSION that the County is

directed to take all necessary actions, whether by itself or as part of a joint undertaking, to

intervene as a defendant in the SSUT litigation and to protect the County's interest in this critical

revenue.
