At a Special called meeting of the Walker County Commission held in their offices in the Walker County Courthouse Annex, Jasper, Alabama, at 9:30 a.m. on the 10th day of March, 2025, Chairman Miller gave the welcome and called the meeting to order.

County Administrator Amy Frederickson called the roll and Commissioners present were John Dunagan, Jeff Burrough, Jim Borden, and Steven Aderholt. Commissioner Burrough gave the invocation and Commissioner Borden led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Having a copy of a letter from County Attorney Charles Stephens, Jr. stating that the matters to be discussed meets the criteria for an Executive Session, motion was made by Commissioner Dunagan and seconded by Commissioner Borden that the Commission retire to Executive Session.

With no discussion, the vote taken resulted as follows: District One: Aye; District Two: Aye; District Three: Aye; District Four: Aye.

On multiple occasions, the Walker County Commission has been asked why the Commission has not acted on the matters involving the Sheriff's Department. The Walker County Commission's authority is limited. More specifically, the Commission is responsible for maintaining county buildings, roads and approving the County's budget. However, beyond budgetary issues, the Commission has no

authority to govern a Constitutionally Elected Official. And as such, Sheriff Smith is entitled to operate his department as he sees fit.

The above notwithstanding, this Commission remains committed to the interests of justice and will continue to cooperate fully with Federal authorities throughout the remainder of their investigations.

We thank you, and at this time I would entertain a motion to adjourn."

Motion was made by Commissioner Borden and seconded by Commissioner Aderholt that this meeting be adjourned to reconvene at the next regularly scheduled meeting.

With no discussion, the vote taken resulted as follows: District One: Aye; District Two: Aye; District Four: Aye.

With no opposition, the Chairman declared the motion carried.
